Core timestamps

02:14 - Jamie reports four contacts.

11:35 - Accused: "Again, I need a translator."

11:43 - Bittony: "I know. There's no translator here, but I'm going to try. I'm going to talk to you."

11:46 - Bittony says the accused must understand because he is "arguing" with him.

11:51 - Accused: "No."

17:06 - Accused: "I'm not arguing... By the way, I speak little bit."

17:11 - Bittony: "We don't have a translator."

18:07 - Bittony asks where they are coming from; accused answers, "Me? I'm from India." Bittony clarifies he meant the bus origin.

18:42 - Accused: "I'm not speak proper English."

18:59 / 19:03 - Bittony asks what Jamie said he was doing; accused responds, "What?" and the question is repeated.

20:00 - Accused: "I'm not speak proper English, sir."

20:34 - Accused again asks Bittony to ask nearby people/passengers.

34:47 - Bittony: "He's not in trouble with me. You're not going to go to jail."

34:52 - Bittony: "I have to gather all the evidence to put it together into a report."

38:37 - Civilian assisting with translation says the accused is suggesting Jamie may "want money or something."

38:46 - Bittony: "Possibly. I understand."

41:15 - Bittony: "I understand that people, people do stuff like this..."

41:16 onward - Civilian assisting with translation gives an insurance-claim analogy involving braking in front of a truck.

41:28 - Bittony: "Oh, yeah. Yeah. Definitely."

Additional review points

My review identifies six instances in which the reported conduct is presented to the accused as generic "touching."

My review identifies ten alternative explanations supplied or reintroduced by Bittony during the questioning.

The report should be compared directly against the body-camera recording, including the four-contact count, the private-area allegation, the source of favorable accused-side language, and the financial/fabrication sequence.

The complete recording should be reviewed in context rather than relying only on isolated quotations.
